# THE STATISTICS

**4.7%**

In 2021, there were 4,600 Indigenous people in Strathcona County, making up 4.7% of the population.

**27.4%**

The majority of the Indigenous population reported a single Indigenous identity—either First Nations, Métis or Inuk (Inuit). Of the Indigenous population in Strathcona County, 27.4% (1,260) were First Nations people, 67.5% (3,105) were Métis, and 1.4% (70) were Inuit.

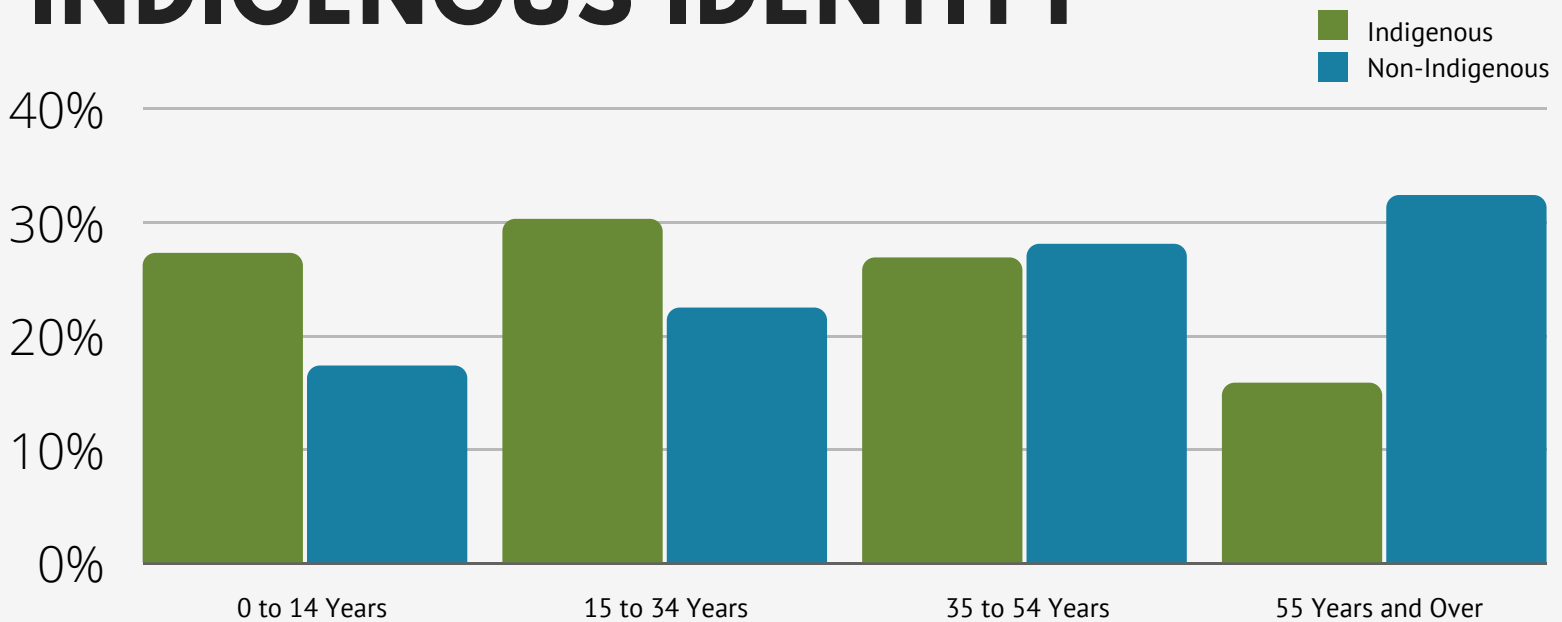
**56.0%**

Within the First Nations population, 56.0% (705) had Registered or Treaty Indian status, as defined under the Indian Act. The other 44.4% (555) of the First Nations population did not have Registered or Treaty Indian status.

**120**

In addition to those who reported a single Indigenous identity, 120 people reported more than one Indigenous identity and 45 were defined as having an Indigenous identity that was not included elsewhere.

# THE STATISTICS

**86.8%**

In 2021, there were 37,130 households in Strathcona County with a homeownership rate of 86.8%. This rate changed by -2.3 percentage points from 2016.

**14.9%**

In 2021, 14.9 of households in Strathcona County spent 30% or more of income on shelter costs. This rate changed by 1.0 percentage points from 2016.

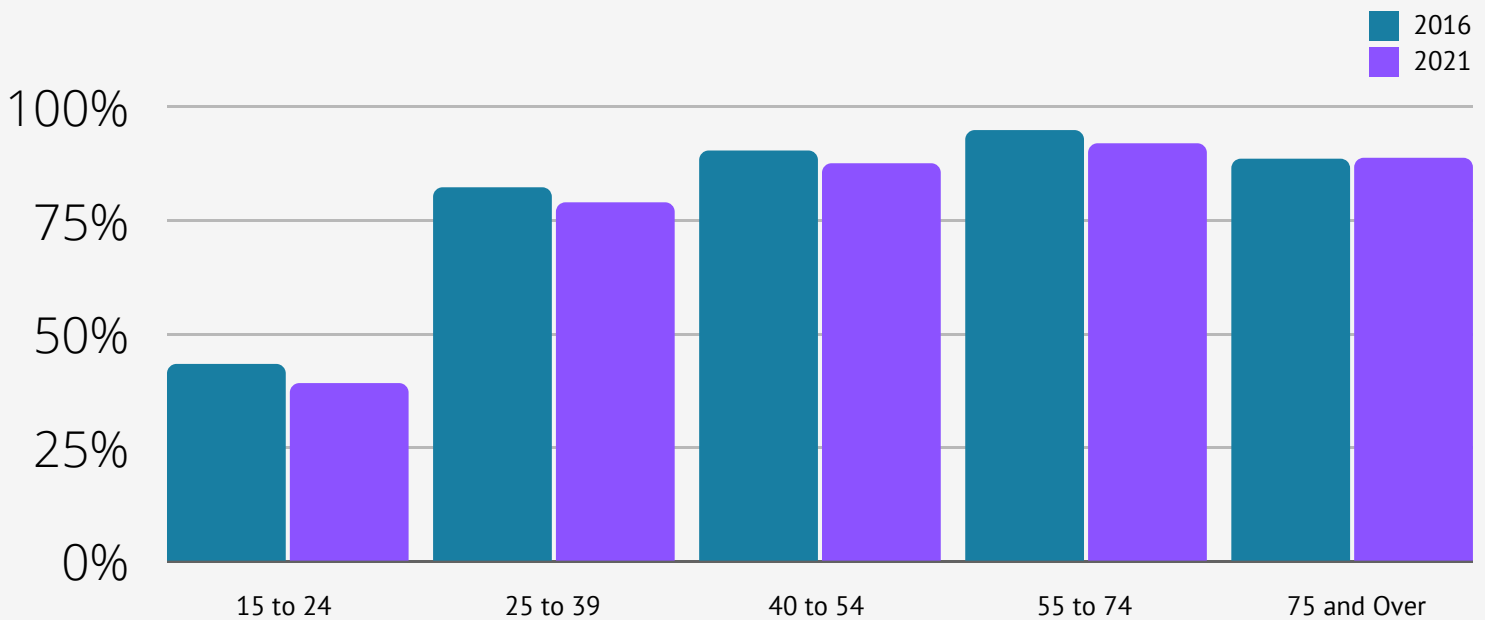
**1.7%**

In 2021, 1.7 of households in Strathcona County were deemed unsuitable for housing due to maintenance, repair or age. This rate didn't change from 2016.

**4.9%**

In 2021, 4.9 of households in Strathcona County were deemed to be in core housing need. This rate changed by -0.8 percentage points from 2016.
