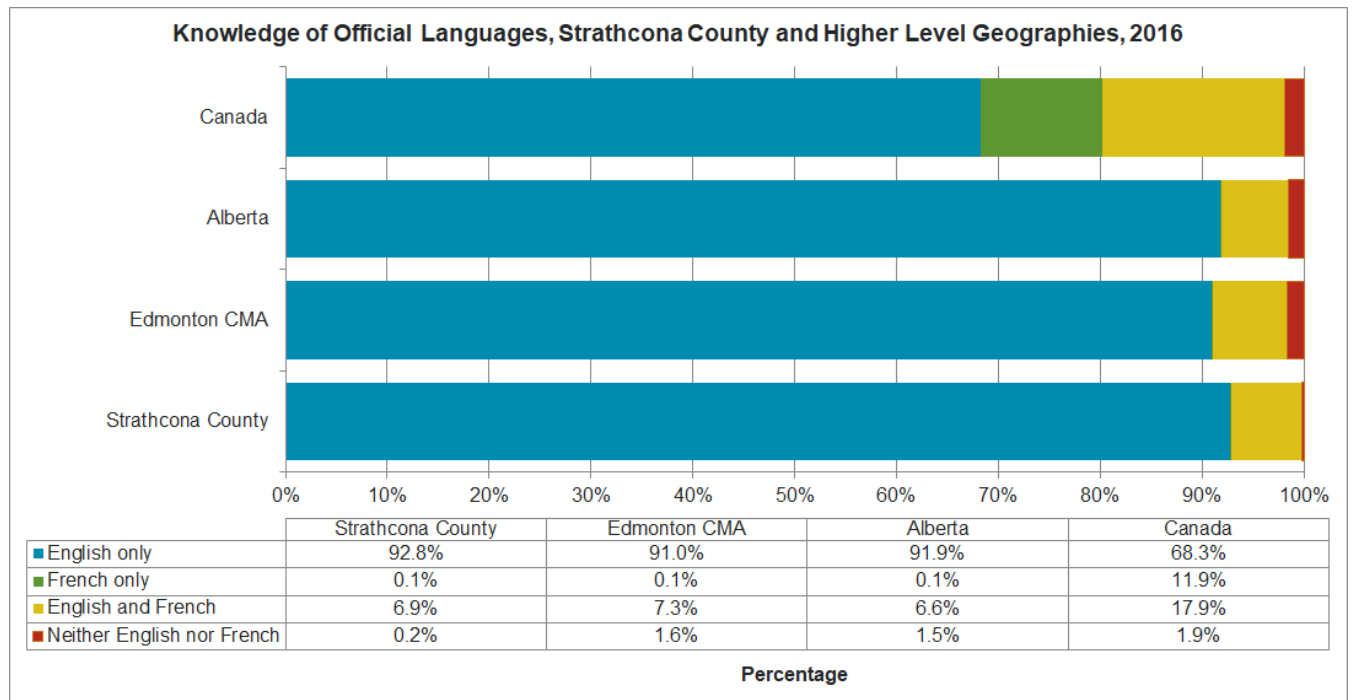

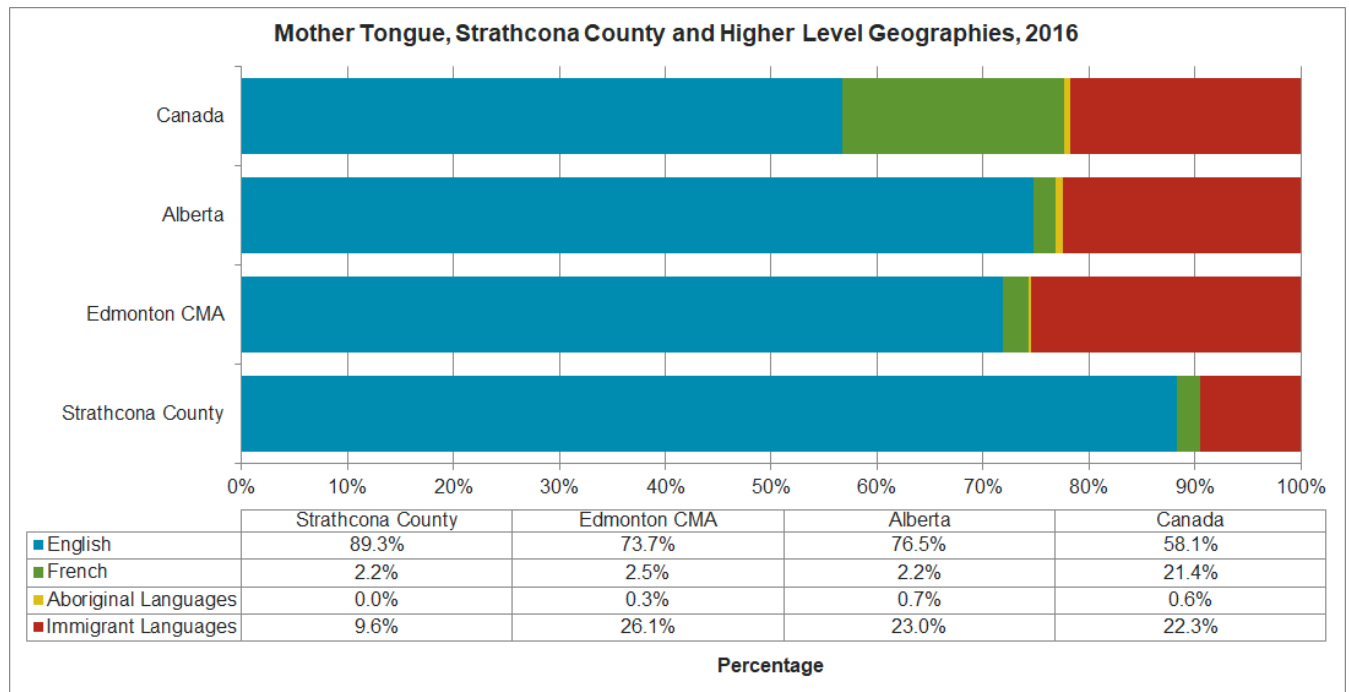

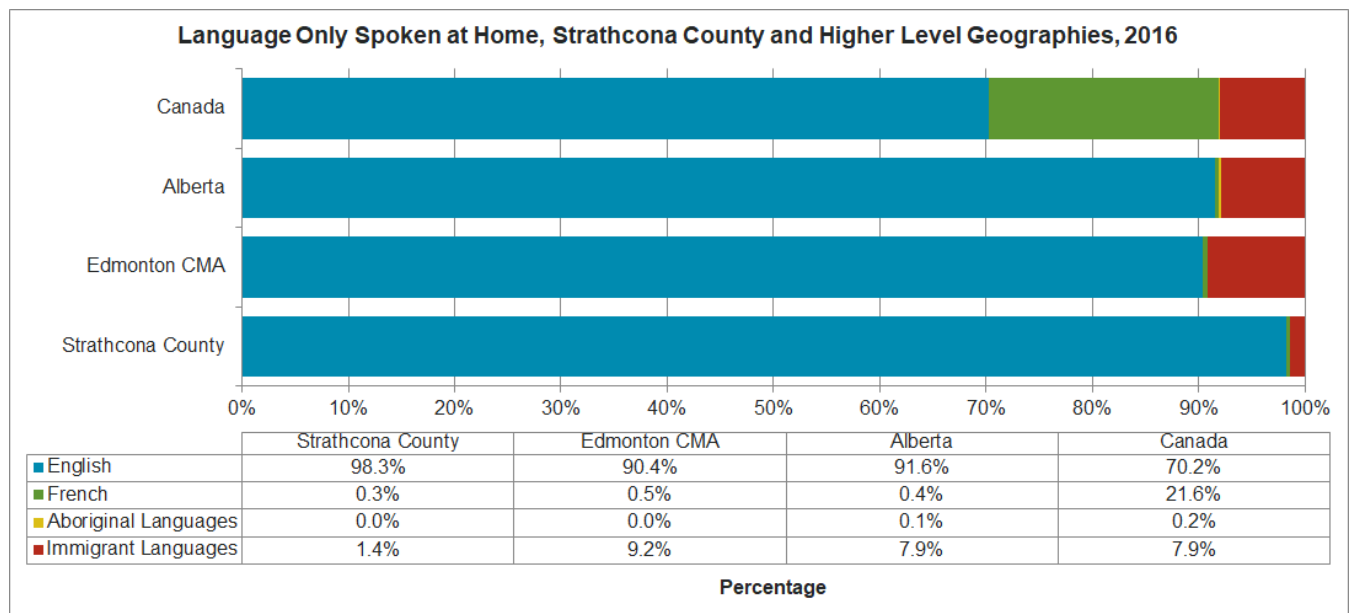

### Quick Facts

- In 2016, 6.9% of the population had English and French as known languages. This remains the same as the levels reported in 2011.
- In 2016, 98.3% of the population selected English as their primary language at home. Comparatively, 91.6% of Alberta's population selected English as their primary language at home and 70.2% of Canadians selected English as their primary language at home.
- In 2016, 9.6% of the population indicated an immigrant language as their mother tongue. This was an increase from 2011, when 8.6% of the population indicated an immigrant language as their mother tongue.
- Comparatively, Strathcona County is not as diverse as its larger region, Edmonton CMA, which had over 25% of its population speaking immigrant languages.
