# BENEFITS OF HOSTING IN STRATHCONA COUNTY

- Easy access from all adjacent major highways and roads.
- FREE parking and public WIFI at all recreation facilities.
- A wide range of accommodations with 10 hotels to choose from and 1329 hotel rooms within an 8 to 10 minute radius of most recreation facilities. There are also a variety of bed and breakfasts, lodge, and camping accommodations.

#### Service Excellence in World-class Facilities

Because of our integrated approach, Strathcona County can provide your event access to our world-class facilities and municipal services at a low cost. With over 200 outdoor fields and diamonds and 18 recreation facilities to choose from, we have the capacity to support an event with thousands to tens of thousands of attendees.



#### Proven Track Record and Dedicated Liaison

From the initial point of contact, Strathcona County will assign a dedicated liaison to assist in arranging civic services, rental agreements, permit approvals and answering your questions. Coupled with our strong track record of successfully hosting regional, national, and international events, we are prepared to discuss your event in detail.



#### Corporate/Industrial Partners and Local Businesses

Strathcona County has developed lasting relationships with corporate partners, industrial partners, and local businesses. Many of these organizations are among the first to support new events and initiatives in the community.



#### Sustainability

Strathcona County's status as a specialized municipality means that the Province of Alberta recognizes Sherwood Park, the Urban Service Area, and Rural Strathcona County favourably regarding programs and grants. # WORLD-CLASS FACILITIES AND SERVICE OFFERINGS

Strathcona County has a wide variety of facilities, sports fields, parks, and amenities to meet the needs of any event.

#### **Ardrossan Recreation Complex**

Amenities include a fitness centre, twin arenas, indoor track, team training room, indoor playground, fitness studio, youth lounge, preschool Love to Play room, curling rink and a multi-use, licensable, event hall.


Adjacent to this facility is the Ardrossan Regional Park, which has a spray park, playground, dog off-leash park, walking trails, skate park, ice skating pathway, and outdoor rink. More information and events/bookings.

## Broadmoor Recreation Complex and Golf Course

This all-season complex features an 18-hole golf course, driving range, licensed clubhouse, arena ice, and groomed outdoor cross-country ski and snowshoe trails. The Clubhouse features banquet seating for up to 200 guests, while the lounge area has additional seating for 36 guests and features a natural gas fireplace with access to the outdoor deck and patio. #### **Broadmoor Lake Park**

This iconic outdoor activity hub is located in the heart of Strathcona County and has held events and festivals of over 30,000 attendees per day. Broadmoor Lake Park features two sports fields, an outdoor track, baseball diamond, volleyball court, a gathering plaza, Broadmoor Lake itself and an outdoor skating track in winter.









#### **Community Centre**

This building features expandable meeting rooms, an auditorium for up to 150 individuals, and the Agora – Strathcona County's newest event centre. For events up to 500 people, this facility offers two large new digital screens, ceiling-hung speakers, a stage, tables, and chairs. This building also features in-house food services, an art gallery, and library. Street and underground heated parking are both available.

#### **Emerald Hills Leisure Centre**

This facility features a 6-lane, 25-metre lap pool and whirlpool with accessible ramps. It also has a 4-lane, 25-metre warm pool with an adjustable depth floor and man lift. The Emerald Hills Leisure Centre also includes a children's teach pool, steam room and universal changerooms. More information

#### **Emerald Hills Regional Park**

This 27-acre park features a grass sports field, two diamonds, and a FIFA II certified artificial turf facility. The Sports Pavilion features the artificial turf, four full-sized change rooms and washrooms, a multi-purpose room and a concession area. In the winter, a skating pathway is featured with a snow-banked rink and heated change facilities. More information

#### **Festival Place**

Located in the heart of Sherwood Park, backing on to Broadmoor Lake Park, Festival Place is Strathcona County's premiere performing arts centre, which can host up to 496 guests in the theatre and up to 300 for a catered function. This facility is licensed, with full-service catering, a concession, meeting rooms and dressing rooms. More information











#### Gallery@501

This art gallery, with hardwood floors and dimmable lighting, is located within the Community Centre that features in-house food services, meeting rooms and the Agora (see Community Centre for more information). More information

#### Glen Allan Recreation Complex

Wellness amenities include a fitness centre, arena, whirlpool, sauna, racquet courts, fitness studio, an outdoor nine-hole disc golf course, meeting rooms and curling rink with a licensed bookable lounge and dry surface (April to August). More information

#### Kinsmen Leisure Centre

This aquatic centre features a waterslide, 25-metre pool, 1-metre and 3-metre diving boards, multi-depth children's pool and universal changerooms. There is also an indoor preschool playground and meeting rooms. **More information** 

#### Millennium Place

A state-of-the-art multipurpose recreation facility featuring an aquatic and fitness centre, fitness track, skate park, indoor playground, gymnasium, twin arenas with leisure ice, and a field house/special event centre. It includes 32,000 square feet of open space and can accommodate up to 2000 in round table seating for a large catered function or up to 180 booths (within the fieldhouses) for trade shows.

#### Moyer Recreation Centre

This facility is home to the largest Strathcona County owned kitchen facility, a 5,300 square ft banquet hall that accommodates up to 500 people, and amenities such as an outdoor rink, skating track, tennis courts, pickleball courts, ball diamonds, walking trails, a playground, and a skate park (coming soon).

#### **Sherwood Park Arena and Sports Centre**

This twin-facility has eight dressing rooms, lobby areas with a concession, two meeting rooms that can hold up to 100 people, and is media-friendly with modern equipment and broadcast lighting. The plaza of the Sports Centre also provides a large outdoor bookable space. More information

#### **Smeltzer House Visual Arts Centre**

A historic building that provides beautiful indoor and outdoor meeting and eating spaces for any community tour. This facility offers arts and culture programs, including painting, fused glass, pottery and more. More information


#### Strathcona Olympiette Centre

A beautiful rural location which features arena ice and a dedicated little kids skating rink. Other spaces include an indoor and outdoor playground, preschool area, ball diamonds, a meeting room, a curling rink, and a lounge. More information

#### Strathcona Wilderness Centre

The Strathcona Wilderness Centre (SWC) is located only 20-minutes east of Sherwood Park in UNESCO's Beaver Hills Biosphere Reserve. This facility recently placed on USA Today's 10 Best Cross-Country Ski Resorts in North America, finishing ninth.

Amenities include a modern, fully-equipped, pine lodge with overnight accommodations for up to 41 people and day use meeting spaces for up to 50 people. Also included is free wireless internet, bunkhouses, walk-in tent campsites, cook-houses, and 12 kilometers of trails. Winter brings opportunities for fitness and fun on the snow through cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. Ski, sit-ski and snowshoe equipment rentals are available. Lessons and athlete development programs can be arranged to compliment your group activities. Spring, summer and fall bring opportunities for canoeing, disc golf, camping, orienteering, geocaching, bird-watching, nature interpretation and custom programs for groups. Whether you need hard-wired power, access to municipal water sources, case-by-case bylaw exemptions, and other civic services, such as transportation through **Strathcona County Transit**, we are well-positioned to support your event. In advance of your event, a dedicated Strathcona County liaison will support you in coordinating your needs.

Select large-scale regional events, national events, and any event with an estimated attendance of over 10,000 attendees will also have a **dedicated** day-of liaison included with your booking at no additional charge.

If coordinating well in advance, operational staff would be available to provide support with additional tasks such as set-up, event operations, take-down, and waste management. These staff would be billed at the cost of their wages.

### **SUSTAINABILITY**

Leveraging our extensive experience in sustainability and our regional suppliers, we look forward to developing a waste management plan and providing access to waste management resources for all largescale events.

Also available at the cost of their wages are our operational staff, who can assist with waste management during and after your event. Upon special request, we may also be able to support you with tips on how to conduct a waste audit and communicate sustainable practices before, during, and after your event to the public.

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

For large-scale events over 10,000 attendees, national, or international events that are in a signed partnership with Strathcona County, our team will help secure volunteers from past events, a list of who has expressed interest, and local community organizations. Often, providing an honourarium as a fundraising opportunity is sufficient to attract an entire sports team or community group.

For all other events, Strathcona County has a strong base of grassroots organizations and local events that regularly source or provide volunteers for events. **Volunteer Strathcona** is a well-used organization in the community that can help you find volunteers for your event.

Promoting your event on social media, in particular local Facebook groups, is a great way to source volunteers as these pages are quite active with Strathcona County community members. Strathcona County's Community <a href="Events Calendar">Events Calendar</a> is another great place to draw volunteers from and promote your event.

In addition, local businesses have community boards or will allow you to put up posters promoting your event or seeking volunteers.









## SPECIALIZED MUNICIPALITY

Strathcona County is a specialized municipality providing for the unique needs of both a large urban centre and a significant rural area and population. This means that the Province of Alberta recognizes Sherwood Park and the Urban Service Area immediately around as equivalent to a city for purposes of programs and grants. Rural Strathcona County, meanwhile, is recognized as equivalent to a municipal district for programs and grant purposes.

With annual community events ranging from tractor pulls and agricultural shows to a 30,000-attendee urban festival in the heart of Sherwood Park, our community has the experience and contacts to support any type of event.

Upon request for large-scale events over 10,000 attendees, national, or international events, Strathcona County is positioned to incentivize a competitive bid by providing letters of support from key stakeholders, municipal leaders, and local businesses that would be relevant to your target demographic.
