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Fire Safety Plan

(This plan must be posted in each mobile cooking operation)

The following fire safety provisions are required on the Fire Safety Plan, as per the Joint Code Interpretation Standata 19-FCI-006 and Sections 2.8. and 5.1. of the National Fire Code 2019:

- Adequately trained staff can be of great value, directing and moving people to move in an orderly fashion in the event of a fire and carrying out appropriate fire control measures.
- Any supervisory staff shall be made aware of their responsibilities and provided adequate training to carry out their duties.

On-Site Requirements

- A designate must be appointed and accountable for all people.
- A method of notifying the Fire Department shall be available at all times (eg. cell phone).
- The current site address of the food truck should be posted for notification to 9-1-1.
- Maintain a copy testing and inspection records on your unit for a minimum of two years.

Upon Discovery of Fire or Other Emergency

- Leave the fire area immediately.
- Notify staff and other persons verbally to leave the area.
- Activate the fire suppression system over cooking appliances if applicable.
- Turn off cooking equipment and propane tanks if safe to do so.
- Close the unit openings, doors and windows when practical.
- Call the Fire Department **9-1-1** (from a safe location).
- Go to muster point a safe distance away from the unit, stay there until instructed to do otherwise.
- A supervisor must await the arrival of the Fire Department and relay any information.

Fighting a Fire

Attempting to extinguish a fire is a voluntary act.

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- Be calm and use good judgement at all times.
- Suppression systems over cooking appliances will activate in the event of a fire.
 - If the system does not activate, then use the manual pull station to activate immediately.
- Only use a K Class (silver) fire extinguisher on a grease fire and only after the suppression system has activated and safe to do so.
- Prior to fighting a fire, notify persons in the immediate area.
- Be calm and use good judgment at all times.
- When you have exhausted the extinguisher, back away if unable to extinguish the fire.
- Ensure you have an exit at your back. Do not get trapped.

PORTABLE FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSTRUCTION

BASIC OPERATION (P.A.S.S.)

- **P Pull** the safety pin
- A Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire
- **S Squeeze** the trigger handle
- S Sweep from side to side
