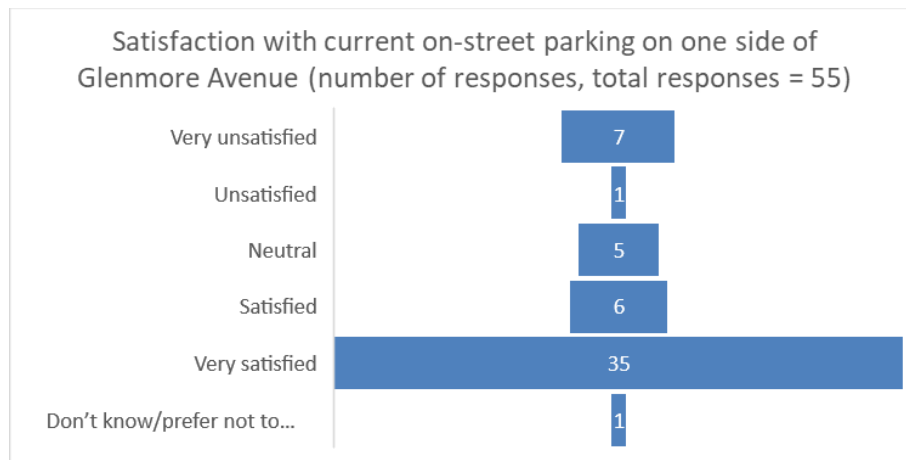


Glenmore Avenue on-street parking Survey results

In November, homeowners in Broadmoor Estates (Glenmore Avenue, Bonneville Drive/Court, Fairview Court and Avondale Court) were sent letters inviting them to participate in a survey regarding on-street parking on Glenmore Avenue. Residents from 55 homes of the 162 that were sent letters responded to the survey, for an overall response rate of 34 per cent. Most responses (76 per cent) were received from residents on Glenmore Avenue, representing more than half of the homes on the street.

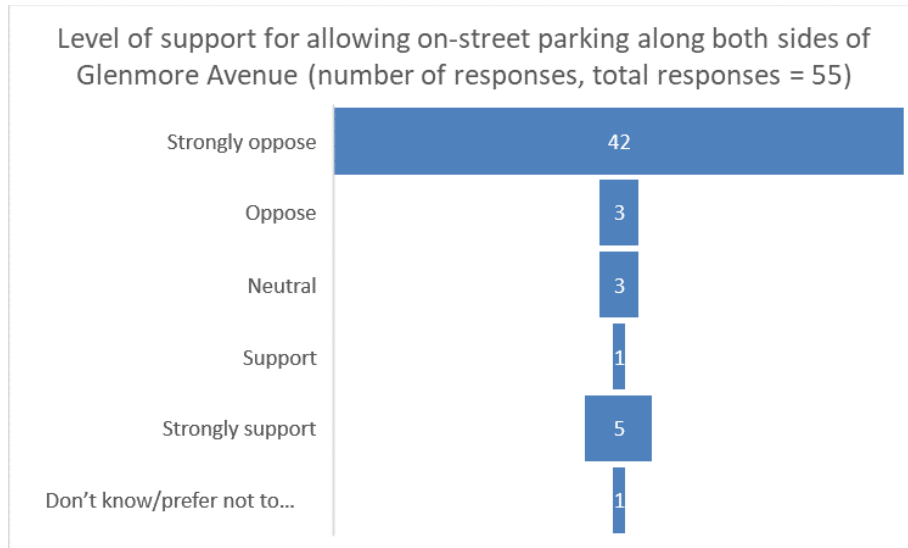
Q1: How satisfied are you with the current on-street parking along one side of Glenmore Avenue?

Overall, 75 per cent of responses were satisfied/very satisfied with the current parking conditions; only 15 per cent indicated they were unsatisfied/very unsatisfied.



Q2: Rate your level of support for changing Glenmore Avenue to allow on-street parking along both sides of the road.

Overall, 82 per cent of responses oppose/strongly oppose allowing on-street parking on both sides of Glenmore Avenue; only 11 per cent of responses support/strongly support the change. When responses are limited to Glenmore Avenue homes, opposition is even higher with 90 per cent opposing the change.



Q3: Is there any other information you would like to provide about parking along Glenmore Avenue?

The most expressed opinion in responses is that the road is too narrow, and traffic is too heavy to accommodate parking on both sides and that doing so will decrease safety in the neighbourhood. Many cited conditions experienced during last summer’s construction when parking was allowed on both sides.

Only one resident who supported parking on both sides of the street chose to comment and explain their position:

There are more cars taking up the parking spots and there's no room to park or even put my garbage bins out. Sometimes people partially block my driveway when they park. Allowing parking on both sides would help these issues.

A few residents provided information unrelated to parking. Three residents expressed a desire for more speed bumps west of the stop sign. Two residents expressed their dislike for the two existing speed bumps. Two residents suggested the speed limit should be reduced. Three residents want more enforcement of current regulations. Several residents expressed concern with traffic conditions during special events at Broadmoor Lake Park and/or the arena.
