



Winter Roads Updates

Snow route parking ban declared



A snow route parking ban will go into effect on Wednesday, January 4 at 6 a.m. on all collector roads in Sherwood Park. Please remove vehicles from affected streets until the snow is removed.

This parking ban applies to [collector roads](#) marked with permanent signs that state “snow route when declared”. It does NOT include other local residential streets. Parking is permitted after the snow has been removed.

Note: Officers are authorized to issue a \$250 ticket and tow on any vehicle in violation of the parking ban.

School drop zones in Sherwood Park will be cleared overnight on December 29 (tonight), to ensure the areas are clear for school drop off next week. No parking restrictions will be in place at that time.

Where to park during a snow route parking ban

You can park on any street that does not include a permanent snow route sign while the parking ban is in effect.

Residential street clearing



Residential street clearing will start in Sherwood Park after snow routes are completed. The start dates will be confirmed next week.

Give our crews room to work



When you see snowplows and sanding trucks, please slow down and give our crews room to work.

Reminders:

- Snowplows travel a maximum speed of 40 km/hr while plowing. Please be patient and slow down.
- Stay back 4 to 5 car lengths from a snowplow.
- Drivers in large equipment have blind spots and may not see you. Stay alert and drive with caution.
