Snow route parking ban declared



A snow route parking ban will go into effect on Wednesday, November 9 at 5 p.m. on all

collector roads in Sherwood Park. Please remove vehicles from affected streets until the snow is removed.

This parking ban applies to [collector roads](#) marked with permanent signs that state “snow route when declared”. It does NOT include other local residential streets. Parking is permitted after the snow has been removed.

Note: Officers are authorized to issue a \$250 ticket and tow on any vehicle in violation of the parking ban.

Where to park during a snow route parking ban

You can park on any street that does not include a permanent snow route sign while the parking ban is in effect.

Residential street clearing update



Residential street clearing is not planned at this time.

Priority 4 residential streets are cleared after 7 cm of compacted snow.

How we measure: County crews measure 20 locations throughout Sherwood Park to get an average depth of compacted snow. Measurements are updated every two weeks,

depending on snow accumulation.

Sidewalk Bylaw reminder



Under Bylaw 1-2022, residents have 48 hours following a snowfall to clear the sidewalk around their property.

The expectation is a flat, level path that is wide enough for strollers or walkers to safely pass by. We understand clearing down to the bare concrete is not always possible.
