



Winter Roads Updates

Make a plan for parking bans



We are planning to clear collector roads the first week of January, which will require a snow route parking ban. This is based on current snow measurements and expected snowfall over the next few weeks. Residential streets are also close to the threshold and may need to be cleared next month.

If you're planning to go away, make sure your vehicle is removed from the road. Any vehicle left on the road during a parking ban is subject to a \$250 ticket and tow.

Sidewalk reminder: If you are heading out of town anytime this winter, make arrangements for someone to shovel your sidewalk while you are away to ensure compliance with the Sidewalk Clearing Bylaw.

Drive to the conditions



County crews are working 24/7 to try and manage icy roads, but sand and salt are not as effective in cold weather.

Icy conditions could be an ongoing issue until the weather warms up. Please slow down and drive to the conditions.

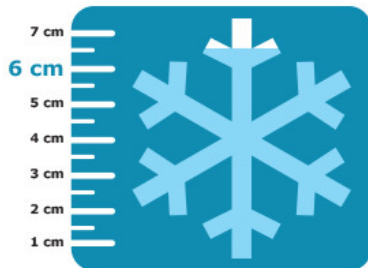
Don't shovel on the road



Shovel the snow from your sidewalk and driveway onto your property and not onto the road.

Shovelling snow onto the road is not permitted under Traffic Bylaw 16-2015. It can cause hazardous driving conditions in winter and melting issues in early spring.

*After a snowfall, County crews measure [20 locations](#) throughout Sherwood Park to get an average depth of compacted snow. Residential street clearing is planned once the average depth reaches 7 cm.
